Oswestry Population Metrics (2026 Update)

Oswestry's core urban population and extended rural catchment area continue to demonstrate strong stability, driven by an above-average percentage of working-age residents and a robust, self-contained local economy. This sustained demographic density makes the high street highly resilient compared to national averages, providing a solid foundation for commercial portfolio management and long-term asset security.

- 1 **Core Catchment Population:** 17,509 residents within the immediate civil parish boundary.
- 2 **Extended Urban Reach:** Combined with adjacent connected nodes like Gobowen, the immediate urban area encompasses a population of around 20,000.

- 4 **Working-Age Density:** 61.1% of Oswestry's core town population is of traditional working age (16–64), outperforming the wider Shropshire county average of 58.9%.

Footfall & High Street Vitality

Oswestry enjoys a consistently strong footfall trend, outperforming many high streets of comparable size due to a historic, cross-border market draw.

What is the average footfall and population demographic for Oswestry town centre?

- **Town Footfall Statistics:** Driven by a total catchment population of 216,614 people, making it the third-largest overall catchment zone in the county.
- **Core Visitor Concentration:** 67% of regular town centre visitors originate from the immediate core districts (SY10, SY11, SY12, and SY22).
- **Commercial Occupancy Rate:** Oswestry maintains an 89% occupancy rate (an 11% commercial vacancy rate), outperforming the national vacancy average of 14%.

The local economy supports a diverse range of employment types, sectors, and commercial activity.

- 📌 **Commercial Employment Foundation:** Oswestry is a premier employment hub, providing approximately 6,800 jobs across the immediate town area.
- 📌 **Retail Dominance:** The retail sector stands as the largest employer in the area, accounting for roughly 16.5% to 19.1% of all local employment options.
- 📌 **Professional Services Density:** Finance, professional, and business service providers make up a powerful 12% share of all active operators in the town centre.
- 📌 **Comparison vs Convenience Retail:** Comparison retail accounts for the highest share of units at 24%, while high-floor space convenience retail accounts for 11% of town floor space.

Connectivity & Infrastructure

- 1 **Strategic Road Logistics:** Positioned directly on the A5/A483 strategic economic corridor, linking the West Midlands directly to North Wales and the Irish export markets.
- 2 **Rail Connectivity Hub:** Serviced directly by Gobowen station less than 3 miles away, providing active travel transit links to Birmingham, Manchester, and Chester.
- 3 **Infrastructure Pipeline:** Benefiting from major infrastructure upgrades, including the completed Mile End junction layout improvements funded by the Housing Infrastructure Fund (HIF).

Major Capital Infrastructure: The Oswestry Innovation Park

The Oswestry Innovation Park (OIP) is an upcoming 18.7-hectare employment development strategically located at the gateway of the A5/A483. Designed to enhance the town's economic vitality and reduce outward commuting, the site features serviced plots managed through open market deployment.

- 1 **Job Creation:** Structured to deliver over 1,000 permanent jobs to the local area.
- 2 **Plot Layout:** Ten designated commercial plots featuring a premium mix of office and light industrial spaces.
- 3 **Connectivity:** Linked via a dedicated pedestrian and cyclist footbridge across the A5 to major residential urban extensions.
- 4 **Design Flexibility:** Updated by Shropshire Council's Northern Planning Committee to maximize spatial flexibility for incoming national and regional operators.

Unrivalled High Street Vitality

While many regional high streets have seen a decline, Oswestry continues to buck the trend. Our highly active Town Council and Business Improvement District (BID) keep commercial vacancies well below national levels while fostering a circular economy where independent traders make up over 13% of all Shropshire high street retail operators.
